Ms. JACKSON LEE (for herself and Ms. BASS) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, and in addition to the Committees on the Judiciary and Ways and Means, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned

A BILL

To authorize funding to increase access to mental health
care treatment to reduce gun violence.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Mental Health Access
5 and Gun Violence Prevention Act of 2016”.

6 **SEC. 2. FINDINGS.**

7 The Congress finds as follows:

1 (1) Suicide is the leading cause of gun related
2 deaths in America. More than 60 percent of deaths
3 by guns in the country are the result of individuals
4 using these weapons as a means to commit suicide.
5 Some of these deaths might have been prevented if
6 there were adequate background checks.

7 (2) Victims of domestic abuse are more likely to
8 become victims of homicide when a gun is present.
9 Further, individuals who suffer from mental illnesses
10 are more likely to be victims rather than perpetra-
11 tors of violence.

12 (3) Approximately 1 in 4 American adults have
13 a mental illness and nearly half of all adults in
14 America will develop at least one mental illness dur-
15 ing their lifetime.

16 (4) Less than half of children and adults with
17 diagnosable mental health problems receive the
18 treatment they need.

19 **SEC. 3. AUTHORIZATION OF FUNDING TO INCREASE AC-**
20 **CESS TO MENTAL HEALTH CARE TREATMENT**
21 **TO REDUCE GUN VIOLENCE.**

22 There is authorized to be appropriated to the Attor-
23 ney General of the United States, the Secretary of Health
24 and Human Services, and the Commissioner of Social Se-
25 curity \$500,000,000 for fiscal year 2017 to carry out pro-

1 grams and activities authorized by provisions of law other
2 than this Act—

3 (1) to increase access to mental health care
4 treatment and services; and

5 (2) to encourage and assist the reporting of rel-
6 evant disqualifying mental health information to the
7 National Instant Criminal Background Check Sys-
8 tem.
