A BILL

To amend title 18, United States Code, to temporarily prohibit the transfer of a firearm to, or the possession of a firearm by, a person convicted of a misdemeanor in which a firearm was used, carried, or possessed.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “No Crime Left Behind
5 Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. TEMPORARY PROHIBITION ON THE TRANSFER OF A**
2 **FIREARM TO, OR THE POSSESSION OF A FIRE-**
3 **ARM BY, A PERSON CONVICTED OF A MIS-**
4 **DEMEANOR IN WHICH A FIREARM WAS USED,**
5 **CARRIED, OR POSSESSED.**

6 (a) PROHIBITION ON TRANSFER.—Section 922(d) of
7 title 18, United States Code, is amended—

8 (1) by striking “or” at the end of paragraph
9 (10);

10 (2) in paragraph (11)—

11 (A) by striking “(11)” and inserting
12 “(12)”; and

13 (B) by striking “(10)” and inserting
14 “(11)”; and

15 (3) by inserting after paragraph (10) the fol-
16 lowing:

17 “(11) during the preceding 3 years, completed
18 a sentence imposed under law for a misdemeanor in
19 which a firearm was used, carried, or possessed; or”.

20 (b) PROHIBITION ON POSSESSION.—Section 922(g)
21 of such title is amended—

22 (1) by striking “or” at the end of paragraph
23 (8)(C)(ii);

24 (2) by striking the comma at the end of para-
25 graph (9) and inserting “; or”; and

1 (3) by inserting after paragraph (9) the fol-
2 lowing:

3 “(10) who, during the preceding 3 years, com-
4 pleted a sentence imposed under law for a mis-
5 demeanor in which a firearm was used, carried, or
6 possessed,”.

7 (c) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
8 this section shall take effect 30 days after the date of the
9 enactment of this Act, and shall not apply with respect
10 to any sentence imposed for a misdemeanor conviction en-
11 tered before such date of enactment.
